

As a Christian Community we bring forth these guidelines regarding the Sacrament of infant Baptism. Since this is a Sacrament of Initiation (introduction) to the Catholic Community the following must take place:



- *The parents must be registered at Our Lady of Fatima, and be consistently seen attending Mass in this church.
- *If this is the first child, the parent (s) must attend a Baptismal Preparation class.
- *Godparents must be Baptized, Confirmed, and practicing Catholics. One Godparent is required. If for good reason the Godparent is from out of town, or another Catholic church in town, a letter from his/her pastor is required stating that he/she is a practicing member in good standing.
- *A visitation with the priest is necessary before scheduling a date for the Baptism of the child.
- *Those parents not registered in our parish must have written permission from their pastor to have their child Baptized in our church.

These guidelines are given in order to insure continued growth and participation in the Catholic faith and the Church community.

Today's Ash Wednesday readings share a message of how to best utilize our influence as Christians living in the world. We are ambassadors for Christ. We pray together, as a community and privately. We perform good deeds, but not for others to see. We fast from excess but are not to be glum. The scripture challenges us, invites our curiosity; do we share our Christian values, or keep them quietly to ourselves?

The complicated answer is both/and.

We will spend the next 40 days in quiet contemplation, living Christ's invitation and example of fasting, prayer, and almsgiving. Our readings feel poignant as we bear a cross of ashes on our foreheads, today. Rather than blasting the trumpet of our own holiness, our ashes are intended to remind us that we've got work to do, together.

Questions for further reflection:

- In what ways am I compelled to be more generous to others?
- In what ways could I personally become engaged in doing the work of the Church?
- How will I embrace the call to prayer, fasting, and almsgiving?

Las lecturas del Miércoles de Ceniza de hoy comparten un mensaje de cómo utilizar mejor nuestra influencia como cristianos que vivimos en el mundo. Somos embajadores de Cristo. Rezamos juntos, en comunidad y en privado. Hacemos buenas obras, pero no para que los demás las vean. Ayunamos por exceso, pero no debemos estar tristes. La Escritura nos desafía, invita a nuestra curiosidad; ¿Compartimos nuestros valores cristianos o nos los guardamos en secreto?

La respuesta complicada es ambos/y.

Pasaremos los próximos 40 días en silenciosa contemplación, viviendo la invitación y el ejemplo de Cristo de ayuno, oración y limosna.
